

'THY KINGDOM COME' – PLEASE JOIN IN!



**Thursday, 30th May
(Ascension Day) to
Sunday, 9th June
(Pentecost)**

*'Thy Kingdom Come' is a global prayer movement, initiated by the Archbishops of Canterbury & York in 2016. Since then it has spread to 114 countries, and involves 65 church denominations. It is simply a call to prayer, that more may come to know Jesus. **In our current national predicament, this is very timely!***

Here's what you can do.

First, identify 5 people (family members or friends) you would love to come to know Jesus. And commit to pray for them regularly throughout this 10 day period.

- Use our specially-produced prayer cards, for use at midday (or at some other time) each day.
- Join us for the Prayer Gathering at All Saints on Thursday, 30th at 7.30pm. (Holy Communion at 6.30pm.)
- Join the 24-hour prayer chain, **6pm Thursday, 30th to 6pm Friday 31st**. (Some may choose to fast during that period: from food, TV or social media, maybe?) Come as a couple or as a group to the special prayer space at All Saints, where there will be a variety of resources. Or you can pray at home. Either way, please sign up on the 'doodle poll' on the Grasmoor Mission Community website.

- Come to the Praise Party at All Saints, at the end of the prayer chain – 6.00pm Friday, 31st. Vegetable curry and naan bread provided, + drinks. (You will need to sign up the day before at All Saints, please.)
- Join the Christ Church, Cockermouth Prayer Walk around the town, 4.00-6.00pm on Sunday, 2nd June, starting at Christ Church in Cockermouth.
- Look out for the regular or additional prayer meetings at your own church, and attend where you can:
 - All Saints, 10am Monday
 - Christ Church, Gt Broughton, 7pm Monday
 - Christ Church, Cockermouth, 9am Wednesday.
 - St Bridget's Bridekirk, 4.30pm Wednesday
 - 7pm every evening at (LoLoBu)
